

Throughout the review by the Geographical Association they complimented Jade on her leadership and management skills, especially around the implementation of the Geography curriculum and the rigorous monitoring and evaluations that take place to ensure that there are high quality outcomes. The application was of an extremely high standard and we are incredibly proud of this achievement.











At the end of the Summer Term Jo Davies (Our PE and Sport Lead) achieved Gold in the School Games award 2023-2024. This award recognises the level of competitions we do with other pupils from other mainstream schools within our community. Also, many thanks to all of the staff and parents/carers who have supported our pupils in these competitions which almost always happen outside of the school











The Climate Taskforce has had a remarkable start to the year, with several academies actively participating in our sustainability events:

We are Certified Carbon Literate



Our Sustainability Leads completed Carbon Literacy training provided by Nottingham Trent University, becoming certified carbon literate. NTU also delivered Carbon Management Training to academy site staff and business managers, focusing on sustainability at the site level and carbon accounting in schools. Both of these training sessions were really well received and helped to expand our knowledge and look at what changes we can make as Trust to help combat climate change.



We have received significant support from the national campaign Let's Go Zero, which is aiming for carbon neutrality by 2030. Jo Pettifer attended our recent Sustainability Leads meeting to discuss what Lets go Zero can offer to our Academies to support our sustainability journey. She also met staff at Stanton Vale school to discuss how they can integrate sustainability into their lesson as well as providing hands-on experiences with thermal cameras at Stanton Vale.

Finally, we have been invited by the Association of School and College Leaders (ASCL) to write a three-part blog series about our Trust's sustainability journey. The first blog, detailing our beginnings, was published in September, with the second blog on partnerships coming soon.


Elmsleigh opens new regulation room funded by capital bid
